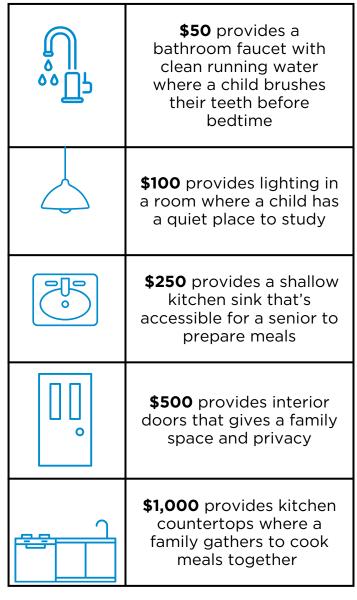
Get started with these simple steps for fundraising:

- Donate first. Consider making the first donation to your fundraiser and show your community your commitment to creating positive change. No matter the size, every donation matters.
