Like so many, Zeeshan followed his faith into the work of Habitat for Humanity. In our work to empower people and families through shelter, Zeeshan saw principles that resonate with his own deeply-rooted beliefs. And in that resonance, Zeeshan finds the drive to serve our community and share the highest principle of all: love.

When you ask Zeeshan about what values from his faith he sees through Habitat, it's clear that putting his faith into action through Habitat is a profound act. He shares a passage from Purification of the Heart by Sheikh Hamza Yusuf: "The disease of hatred is one of the most devastating forces in the world. But the force that is infinitely more powerful is love... the Prophet said, 'None of you has achieved faith until he loves for his brother what he loves for himself."

For Zeeshan, that idea is borne out in his experience. "What I've seen is that people who are most happy are those who have done something for others... I consider myself to be very fortunate that I've been blessed, but the roles could have just as easily been reversed, and I could have been in a much less privileged situation. So, from a faith perspective, it's always important to be grateful for what you have, and to share."

For Zeeshan, Habitat is faith in action. It's taking the principles of love and gratitude that are rooted in his Islamic traditions, and magnifying them outward to serve others through stable, affordable housing. In this work, Zeeshan finds a way to love his neighbor in the truest sense—through generosity, compassion, mutual understanding, and a hand up.

Mike and Emma find fulfillment in action and in community. Mike found Habitat through his employer and hasn't stopped volunteering in the 17 years since. Emma was hooked from her first volunteer day in high school, and returned as an AmeriCorps Crew Leader six years later. Both dove into Habitat and have found purpose, a passion for service, and an appreciation for connections.

For Emma, Habitat is a manifestation of a lifelong sense of purpose —born of her Bay Area roots, which gave her a front row seat at the intersection of economic



inequality and housing need. "Ever since I was little, I couldn't wrap my head around how—as a community, as a world—there could be such wealth disparity. I've been extremely bothered by the housing crisis and affected by it in some ways."

And for Mike, that drive toward justice and opportunity anchors his involvement with

Habitat. He sees housing as one of the key factors "that can actually change the trajectory of people's lives." And his belief in that possibility brings meaning to his time on the Habitat site, especially in his retired life.

Connections are the crux for both. "A huge part of it for me is community coming together to support one another," Emma says.

"The feeling of empowerment when I feel supported by another person... It has that sentimental value of knowing that another human being wanted me to survive and thrive and be sheltered." Mike agrees, asking, "What is the purpose of life?" His answer? "Relationships with other people. What we can accomplish in a collective way." And with a hand in over 200 Habitat homes, Mike knows how to accomplish great things as a community.

From opposite ends of their careers, Mike and Emma found motivation and purpose at the end of a hammer. They're just two among the thousands that volunteer with Habitat each year. Their stories pulse with purpose, and remind us that each person not only gives their time but also their hearts.

Janice and Johnnie are leaders at Habitat, whose roots in public service started in childhood. They're collectors of stories and data. And they're believers in the transformation Habitat brings, and that affordable housing is fundamental to a person's wellbeing.

They've traveled the globe in service of Habitat's mission. From Haiti to Nepal, Malawi to Bangladesh, both have found that a wide-angle lens underscores Habitat's role in changing lives and building equal opportunity.

In Nepal, Janice witnessed our investment in women's microfinance collectives and saw the incredible change for women living in poverty—turning a small loan into a roof repaired, a household's first private toilet, or the seed of a small business that would ensure her family's stability and self-sufficiency. But no matter the locale or the approach, both Janice and Johnnie

see universality in our work. "Having a safe, decent, healthy place to live is universal," Janice says. "It's foundational for every human." Johnnie agrees: "Homes are the jumping off point, that foundational piece that everything else branches off from."

When he thinks of Habitat's work, Johnnie points out that "the equity piece is a really important part of what we're doing, but it doesn't get talked about enough." He notes a study on racial income and credit disparities, which, when looking at the data, found that the key driver was "intergenerational asset transfers. Basically, the wealth that was built up in a home—because that's typically the biggest asset a family has—was being handed down and being leveraged

to send someone to college or buy a car or fix medical problems." Janice adds, "When I look at the work that we do, it's economic empowerment one family at a time, whether domestically or internationally, and I think of what that means to the generational ability of that family, those children, to break the cycle."

It echoes in Habitat's work abroad, and our efforts to serve, empower, and advocate for traditionally underserved people and families. In Malawi, we invest in education on property rights and land tenure, a critical path to security for widowed women and their children. In Nepal, women were long subjected to discriminatory laws that prohibited property ownership—along with those at the lowest end of a caste system. Our investment there

will ensure that these underserved communities secure land and property titles.

Paving the way to better living conditions and more opportunity is key to fighting inequality. For historically underserved communities, Janice says, "so much is stacked up against you, and I find that unconscionable, and yet it happens every day. I'm grateful that we get to chip away at that and break it down."

Though they came to Habitat from different paths, Janice and Johnnie lean on empathy to inform their decisions, fuel their passion for our mission, and drive them to grow Habitat ever closer to a world where everyone has a decent place to live.

To Lena, a healthy community is an ecosystem. "We all feed on each other—the good vibes and the generosity and the kindness and the neighborliness of each other." Making homeownership accessible only nurtures that ecosystem: "When you have a stake in a place, you want to make sure that those amenities are there for you in the long term."

A key component of a thriving community? Diversity and an equal shot at opportunity.

"Historically in the US, housing has not been justly provided. Our history is a history of segregation, of disadvantage, of exclusion for so many people, and I think we're still suffering the consequences of that kind of injustice and inequality and unfairness over so many decades. So, to see Habitat give people of all backgrounds the opportunity to live in neighborhoods where they can enrich the fabric of the community it will create more diversity and a sense of community and belonging for people, and a deeper appreciation for all of our humanity."

Lena sees the "role that housing plays in who we have the opportunity to become in this country," and that's why she thinks "investing in the future through homeownership is so meaningful and really reverses some of the historical trends of unfairness."

Community is personal to Lena-not just a function of her job, but a facet of her character. It's a recognition of the interconnectedness of us all, in the ecosystem of our social fabric. And while she found her way to Habitat through her work, her passion for the cause isn't on the clock.

Building is the core of our programs and services. It's what we do. We're both combatting the immediate housing crisis and planning for the future of our communities—by providing people with the opportunity to build their homes and their futures.





In our Home Preservation Program, homeowners get the repairs and improvements they need to stay healthy and comfortable in the homes and communities they love. Having served 234 people this year, we look to grow our program and repair homes for 1,500 in the next five years. And with initiatives like a three-year partnership with Alameda County, we are confident that we can exceed that goal. With a hand from Habitat, homeowners throughout our service area are building secure futures and better health.

NEW LEASES ON LIFE



Through our Homeownership Program, families priced far out of the market can afford a home to call their own. Like the 30 families who have settled into their new homes at Central Commons in Fremont. Or the families who will join them as we raise the first walls at Esperanza Place, a 42-home Zero Net Energy neighborhood in the heart of Walnut Creek. Or the hundreds to come at our future builds, from Bay Point down to Santa Clara and out to Alameda. Through partnership with Habitat, families build strength, stability, and selfreliance on the sturdy foundation of homeownership.



NEW SKILLS

Through our Housing and Financial Counseling Program, more people are on the way to financial wellness and big life goals like homeownership. Over 1,000 people last year gained tools and skills through one-on-one counseling, financial education workshops, first-time homebuyer classes, and the personalized playlists at our online Financial Education Center. They turned these into great financial habits, more savings, higher credit scores, smart budgets, better housing opportunities, and more. With some guidance from Habitat, thousands more will empower themselves for great things to come.

NEW HOPE

By collaborating with partners like the City of San Jose, HomeFirst, and Abode Services, Habitat has helped hundreds begin their journeys out of homelessness through the five emergency interim housing communities we've built. With the capacity to house nearly 3,000 people a year, these communities offer a secure place to stay—with amenities as simple as a locking door and access to a kitchen and shower, and as profound as the supportive services that will help them make the transition to their next chapter. Securely sheltered by Habitat, our neighbors are building paths to permanent housing.
